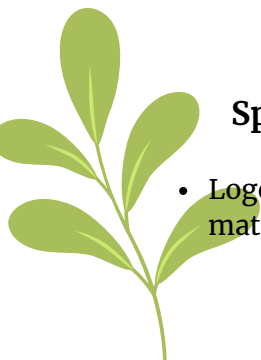

As one of the only Native American-led farms in the Twin Cities, Dream of Wild Health fulfills a unique role in the Native American and local agricultural communities. Originally founded as Peta Wakan Tipi, Dream of Wild Health was created in 1998 as a garden program to recover and preserve the relationship between our people and the land.

The organization has an office in South Minneapolis along the American Indian Cultural Corridor and has grown into 30-acre farm in Hugo, Minnesota. Our programs impact over 12,000 people annually, including 2,000 Native American youth.

Our theory of change starts with our youth. Each year, over 70 Native American youth participate in our leadership and education programs. We often say, we grow seeds and leaders.
